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REPORT OF THE 2nd APT CONFERENCE PREPARATORY GROUP MEETING FOR WRC-07

1. PROCEEDINGS

The Second Asia-Pacific Telecommunity (APT) Conference Preparatory Group Meeting for the World Radiocommunication Conference 2007 (APG2007-2) was held in Bangkok, Thailand from 28 February to 3 March, 2005. The objectives of the Meeting were to review the APG activities to date for WRC-07, to consider the results of ITU-R studies available at this time and to develop some Preliminary Views based on the input documents received from APT Member administrations.

The Meeting was attended by 260 participants representing Members, Affiliate Members, Participating Companies of APT and International/Regional Organizations.

Document APG2007-2/A4 (Rev. 1) contains the list of participants to the meeting.

2. OPENING

Mr. Amarendra Narayan, Executive Director of the APT welcomed delegates and representatives from other regional groups and international organisations to the APG2007-2 meeting at the Joint Meeting of this APG and the APT meeting on the “Role of ICT for Disaster Reduction”, held on 28 February. Mr. Narayan’s welcome address is in Document APG2007-2/2.

Mr. R. N. Agarwal, Chairman of the APG, welcomed everyone to the Joint Meeting. Mr. Agarwal’s address is in Document APG2007-2/3.

3. MEETING ORGANISATION

3.1 Adoption of Agenda

The Agenda was approved following its presentation by the APG Chairman.

The Agenda is in Document APG2007-2/A2. The program of the meeting is in Document APG2007-2/A3 (Rev.4).

3.2 Editorial Committee

The Chairman indicated that, in addition to Mr. Lewis as Chairman of the Editorial Committee, the Chairpersons of the seven Working Parties as well as the Vice-Chairman, APG, would be co-opted as appropriate. Mr. Ninham (AUS) would also assist in the work of the Editorial Group.

3.3 Chairman’s Report on the APT Conference Preparatory Group (APG) Activities for WRC-2007 (Document APG2007-2/5)

The Chairman introduced document APG2007-2/5 reporting on the APG preparatory activities for

WRC-2007. He also referred to document 3, his opening address, and document A5, the APG-2007-2 programme. He noted that a substantial amount of work had already been done since the last meeting and material related to the activities of ITU-R Study Groups and Working Parties had been disseminated electronically.

Mr. Agarwal thanked APT members for their contributions to the meeting, which would allow the APG to make good progress in its initial considerations leading to the development of the APT preliminary views. He also appreciated the work being carried out by the APT Secretariat. In particular he thanked the Executive Director, Mr. Narayan, for his continuing support, as well as Mr Seo and Ms. Alison Ng who have now moved on to new career assignments and whose contributions had helped substantially in the APG work over many years. Furthermore, he welcomed Messrs. Oh and Parvez who have both quickly picked up the work and whose contributions are providing strong support to the work. Mr. Agarwal also thanked Mr. Railton, whose period at the APT was ending, for his work and support over the years. Finally, he also welcomed Mr. Yamada, the recently elected Deputy Executive Director, to the APG work.

Mr. Agarwal reminded participants of the major impact the APG has had in the ITU Radiocommunication Conference activities and he felt that the APG would continue to make substantial contributions in the future. An important ingredient to this success was the strong spirit of mutual cooperation between participants and he encouraged this to continue. He also noted, with appreciation, the cooperation existing with other regional organisations, as well as with other entities and organisations.

Decision no. 1 (APG2007/2/3)

The Plenary approved the Chairman's Report (document no. APG2007-2/05) on the preparatory activities of the APT Conference Preparatory Group for the WRC-07.
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3.4 Objectives, expected outputs, procedures and working methods of APG2007-2

The Chairman noted that the objectives and expected outputs of the meeting were the development of APT provisional views based on consideration of input contributions in the seven Working Parties.

It was noted that the process for the approval of Asia-Pacific Common Proposals to WRC-03 had worked well. It was considered that the same process should be used for the current cycle of work. The Chairman of the Editorial Committee offered to edit a document showing the approval process used for WRC-03 as well as the subsequent administrative mechanism used by the Secretariat to assemble replies from administrations. This would be editorially updated so as to refer to WRC-07 and would be considered later in Plenary for confirmation as the process for the approval of ACPs for WRC-07.

Dr. Wee reminded the meeting that the APT Management Committee is asking all APT Programmes to submit their processes for approval of output documentation to the next MC meeting for information. This same document on the process, once confirmed in Plenary, could serve for this purpose.

Decision no. 2 (APG2007/2/3)

The plenary decided to follow the same process of for the approval of Asia-Pacific Common Proposals (ACPs) to WRC-07 since it had worked well for WRC-03.

Action Item. 1 (APG2007/2/3)

To update the approval process of Asia-Pacific Common Proposals to WRC-03 editorially so to refer to WRC-07.
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3.5 Progress Reports from Working Party Chairmen**Working Party 1 – Dr. Wee**

Dr. Wee reported that he had developed Document 57 as the basis of the work for his group. WP1 would be considering WRC-07 Agenda Items 1.3, 1.4, 1.5 and 1.6.

Working Party 2 – Mr. Wang

Mr. Wang indicated that he had developed Documents 32, 33 and 36 as the basis of the work for Working Party 2. WP2 would be considering WRC-07 Agenda Items 1.2, 1.20 and 1.21. Mr. Wang also advised that ITU-R Task Group 1/9 had just met and it had not been possible to include material based on the output of the TG in these documents, as appropriate. He would introduce the necessary changes during the meetings of WP2.

Working Party 3 – Dr. Kosaka

Dr. Kosaka reported he had developed Document 60 as the basis of the work for Working Party 3. WP3 would be considering WRC-07 Agenda Items 1.7, 1.9, 1.11 and 1.17. He noted that there had been very little discussion at APG2007-1 but that now that studies are proceeding in ITU-R more material is available.

Working Party 4 – Dr. Hashimoto

Dr. Hashimoto reported that he had developed Document 17 as the basis of the work for Working Party 4 and that this would be considered along with contributions from administrations. WP4 would be considering WRC-07 Agenda Items 1.8, 1.18, and 1.19.

Working Party 5 – Mr. Ashman

Mr. Ashman reported he had developed Documents 8 and 64 as the basis of the work for Working Party 5. WP5 would be considering WRC-07 Agenda Items 1.13, 1.14, 1.15 and 1.16. He noted that there was already some relatively mature text available for Agenda Items 1.15 and 1.16 but that more work was needed on the HF allocation issue.

Working Party 6 – Dr. Seong

Dr. Seong reported that she had developed Document 26 as the basis of the work for Working Party 6. WP6 would be considering WRC-07 Agenda Items 1.10 and part of 7.1. She also advised that the results of ITU-R studies to date on Agenda item 1.10 had been posted on the Bulletin Board on the APT web site for use by participants.

Working Party 7 – Mr. Shafiee

Mr. Shafiee reported he had developed Document 18 as the basis of the work for Working Party 7. A second document for this work was also being distributed (Document 73) as a working document towards APT preliminary views on Agenda Items assigned to this Working Party. WP7 would be considering WRC-07 Agenda Items 1.12, 2, 4, 5, 6, 7.1 (status of ITU-R Studies) and 7.2.

Mr. Arasteh, Chairman CPM, advised the meeting that the definitive format of the CPM report was now available as Addendum 2 to ITU-BR Circular Letter CA/128. He also advised that only some 10-12 pages would be available for the text concerning each Agenda item in the CPM report.

4. PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION OF VIEWS AND PROPOSALS OF OTHER INTERNATIONAL/REGIONAL ORGANISATIONS FOR WRC-2007

The following international/regional organisations presented their views on the WRC-2007 agenda items.

Arab Group

Mr. Zaheer informed the meeting that the Group had their initial discussions at its first meeting in January. He further indicated that the Arab Group expected to have some initial texts available as output from its next meeting.

CEPT

Mr. Frederich, Chairman CPG, gave a brief introduction of the current CEPT views on WRC-2007 preparations, which could be found in Document APG2007-2/48. CEPT had also provided document 27, on Agenda Item 1.13. A more detailed presentation would be made in the relevant Working Parties, as appropriate. Documentation is freely available at the European Radiocommunications Office web site (www.ero.dk).

CITEL

Mr. Robert McCaughern, on behalf of CITEL, gave a brief introduction of the current CITEL views on WRC-2007 preparations, which could be found in Document APG2007-2/86. A more detailed presentation would be made in the relevant Working Parties, as appropriate.

Presentations were also made by ICAO (Mr. Rimal, see document 45), the ABU (Mr. Sadhu, see document 77, as well as documents 61, 62 and 71) and the IARU (Dr. Wardlaw, see documents 28 and 47).

Following these presentations, the Chairman, CPM, requested that the CITEL documents be made more readily available.

Mr. Gracie, Chairman, RAG, advised the meeting that, due to ITU budgetary considerations, there is a possibility that the timing of the next WRC may move into early 2008. The ITU Council meeting, to be held in July, 2005, would be considering the issue when dealing with the biennial budget for 2006-7.

Mr. Henri, on behalf of the ITU representatives, thanked the APT for the invitation to this APG meeting.

5. REPORTS ON WORKING PARTY ACTIVITIES

5.1 Report of WP1

Mr. Weller, on behalf of Dr. Wee, reported that APG Working Party 1 had met twice and that its output report could be found in document APG2007-2/79(Rev.1).

Agenda item coordinators/drafting group chairman have been selected and Mr. Weller drew attention to the note on page 1 of the document which refers to the preference to have representatives from more APT members involved in this work.

The WP report was considered by the Plenary and a number of changes were made. A revision 2 of the document will be issued that incorporates these changes.

Mr. Weller thanked participants for their contributions during the discussions. Mr. Agarwal further thanked participants as well as Dr. Wee and Messrs. Weller, Sun and Yoshino, who had capably stood in for Dr. Wee, who was obliged to leave the APG2007-2 meeting at short notice, for their good work.

Decision no. 3 (APG2007/2/5)

The plenary approved the output report of the Chairman of the Working Party 1 (document no. APG2007/79 (Rev.2))

5.2 Report of WP2

Mr. Wang reported that APG Working Party 2 “Space Science Services” had met twice and that its output report could be found in document APG2007-2/70(Rev.2).

Agenda item coordinators/drafting group chairman have been selected and are listed in the document.

The WP report was considered by the Plenary and a number of changes were made. A revision 3 of the document will be issued that incorporates these changes.

Mr. Wang thanked participants for their contributions during the discussions. Mr. Agarwal further thanked participants, as well as Mr. Wang, for their good work.

Decision no. 4 (APG2007/2/5)

The plenary approved the output report of the Chairman of the Working Party 2 (document no. APG2007/70 (Rev.2))

5.3 Report of WP3

Dr. Kosaka reported that WP3 had met twice and that its output report could be found in document APG2007-2/82(Rev.1).

Agenda item coordinators/drafting group chairman have been agreed in WP3 and a further nomination, that of Mr. Alidadi of Iran, was agreed to by the Plenary. They are listed in the document.

The WP report was considered by the Plenary and a number of changes were made. A revision 2 of the document will be issued that incorporates these changes.

Dr. Kosaka thanked participants for their contributions during the discussions. Mr. Agarwal further thanked participants, as well as Dr. Kosaka, for their good work.

Decision no. 5 (APG2007/2/5)

The plenary approved the output report of the Chairman of the Working Party 3 (document no. APG2007/82 (Rev.2))
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5.4 Report of WP4

Dr. Hashimoto reported that WP4 had met twice and that its output report could be found in

document APG2007-2/84(Rev.1).

Agenda item liaison rapporteurs have been selected and are listed in the document.

The WP report was considered by the Plenary and a number of changes were made. A revision 2 of the document will be issued that incorporates these changes.

Dr. Hashimoto thanked participants for their contributions during the discussions. Mr. Agarwal further thanked participants, as well as Dr. Hashimoto, for their good work.

Decision no. 6 (APG2007/2/5)

The plenary approved the output report of the Chairman of the Working Party 4 (document no. APG2007/84 (Rev.2))

5.5 Report of WP5

Mr. Ashman reported that Working Party 5 had met twice and that its output report could be found in document APG2007-2/81(Rev.1).

Agenda item coordinators/drafting group chairman have been selected and are listed in the document.

The WP report was considered by the Plenary and a number of changes were made. A revision 2 of the document will be issued that incorporates these changes.

Mr. Ashman thanked participants for their contributions during the discussions. Mr. Agarwal further thanked participants, as well as Mr. Ashman, for their good work.

Decision no. 7 (APG2007/2/5)

The plenary approved the output report of the Chairman of the Working Party 5 (document no. APG2007/81 (Rev.2))

5.6 Report of WP6

Dr. Seong reported that WP6 had met twice and that its output report could be found in document APG2007-2/85(Rev.1).

Liaison rapporteurs for the work of ITU-R Working Party 4A and the Special Committee have been selected and are listed in the document.

The WP report was considered by the Plenary and a number of changes were made. A revision 2 of the document will be issued that incorporates these changes.

Dr. Seong thanked participants for their contributions during the discussions. Mr. Agarwal further thanked participants, as well as Dr. Seong, for their good work.

Decision no. 8 (APG2007/2/5)

The plenary approved the output report of the Chairman of the Working Party 6 (document no. APG2007/85 (Rev.2))
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5.7 Report of WP7

Mr. Shafiee reported that WP7 had met twice and that its output report could be found in document APG2007-2/87.

Agenda item coordinators/drafting group chairman have been selected for three of the five drafting groups that are being established and they are listed in the document. APT members were requested to provide suitable volunteers for the two remaining DGs.

The WP report was considered by the Plenary and a number of changes were made. A revision 1 of the document will be issued that incorporates these changes.

Mr. Shafiee thanked participants for their contributions during the discussions. Mr. Agarwal further thanked participants, as well as Mr. Shafiee, for their good work.

Decision no. 9 (APG2007/2/5)

The plenary approved the output report of the Chairman of the Working Party 7 (document no. APG2007/81 (Rev.1))

5.8 WP Output Reports

Mr. Lewis, Chairman, Editorial Committee, advised participants that the above mentioned latest revisions to the Working Party reports would be posted on the APT/APG web site and, in addition, that they would be forwarded to APT members as attachments to a circular e-mail that will be sent by the APT Secretariat.

6 APPROVAL PROCESS FOR ACPS

Mr. Lewis introduced document APG2007-2/75, in which the texts relating to the approval process for Asia-Pacific Telecommunity Common Proposals to WRCs (ACPs) were assembled. The texts were based on the process agreed for WRC-03, this having been developed by a Correspondence Group, chaired by Mr. Arasteh (Iran). The texts in the document have been updated so as to be appropriate for the work leading up to WRC-07.

The process was confirmed by the meeting for use in the development and approval of ACPs for WRC-07. Mr. Lewis mentioned a minor editorial correction and advised that a revised version of document 75 would be posted on the APT/APG web site and would also be attached to the circular e-mail mentioned above.

It was further noted that the revised document should be made available to the APT Management Committee, as outlined in Section 3.4 above.

Decision no. 10 (APG2007/2/6)

The plenary approved the approval process for APT Common Proposal (ACPs) to WRC-07 (document no. APG2007-2/75) .
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Action Item. 2 (APG2007/2/6)

The approval process for APT Common Proposal (ACPs) to WRC-07 (document no. APG2007-2/75) would be submitted to the 29 th Session of the APT MC for approval.
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7. APPROVAL OF APG MEETING REPORT

Mr. Lewis recommended that the usual practice of posting the draft meeting report on the APT web site for comments before its final approval be continued. The meeting report would also be forwarded to APT members with the circular e-mail. This was agreed.

Decision no. 11 (APG2007/2/7)

The plenary approved the recommended approach concerning publication of the draft version of the meeting report (document no. APG2007-2/01)

Action Item. 3 (APG2007/2/7)

The final version of the report would be posted on the website and be circulated to the APT members.
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8. LIAISON FROM THE ASIA-PACIFIC TELECOMMUNITY WIRELESS FORUM

Mr. Lewis presented document APG2007-2/06, a liaison statement from the AWF. The AWF was established in September 2004, as a logical extension of the earlier APT IMT-2000 Forum. One aspect of the Terms of Reference of the AWF is work towards harmonisation of spectrum usage in the region. With this role and the potential to conduct spectrum usage studies, the AWF had offered its services to the APG to carry out such studies, if the APG thought it necessary in the context of a particular agenda item being considered at a future WRC.

The meeting welcomed this possibility and Mr. Agarwal would reply to the AWF thanking them for their kind offer.

Decision no. 12 (APG2007/2/8)

The plenary agreed to work together and share studies where necessary with the APT Wireless Forum in reply to the liaison statement from the Wireless Forum to the APG.

Action Item. 4 (APG2007/2/8)

APG would invite the APT Wireless Forum to carry out studies related to spectrum usage in the region if it is necessary in the context of a particular agenda item of the next WRC.

9. NEXT APG MEETING

Mr. Agarwal referred participants to document APG2007-2/5 and the two tables containing programs of meetings.

After some discussion it was seen that the next APG meeting would most likely take place early in 2006. Its timing should take account of the need to be able to consider any likely proposals to the ITU 2006 Plenipotentiary Conference (PP-06) where the advice of the APG may be sought, as well as the program of the ITU-R Special Committee on Regulatory and Procedural Matters. Furthermore, account will need to be taken of potential clashes with the meeting of ITU-R Working Party 8F (to be held in Asia) which take place from 25 January to 1 February, 2006, as well as the need for some administrations to be involved in meetings, occurring from 9 to 19 February, 2006, which are associated with the 2006 Regional Radiocommunication Conference (RRC-06). Mr Narayan advised the meeting that he would take account of these timings as well as those of other APT and ITU events when establishing the dates for the APG2007-3 meeting.

Participants were reminded that they should ensure that any potential APT proposals to PP-06 (especially those relating to the work of the APG) should be submitted for consideration at the next meeting of the APT PP-06 Preparatory Group, which will take place in June 2005.

The meeting also considered that the time to be allocated to APG2007-3 should be a minimum of five days, in order that the expected necessary work can be carried out with a good level of care and consideration.

The administration of Malaysia announced that it would invite the APT to hold this next meeting in Malaysia. The meeting thanked the Malaysian administration for this kind invitation.

In the context of APG meeting planning it was noted that Mr. Gracie, Chairman of the Radiocommunication Advisory Group, had already advised the meeting that there is a possibility that the next WRC may be held later than currently planned. Its timing could move into early 2008.

Dr. Seong (KOR) reminded the meeting of the invitation of her Government to hold the final APG meeting (APG2007-5) in the Republic of Korea, which was announced at the APG2007-1 meeting. The meeting again thanked the Republic of Korea, through Dr. Seong, for this kind invitation.

Annex 1 contains a Draft Table of Meetings relevant to APG activities.

Decision no. 13 (APG2007/2/9)

The plenary decided to have the 3 rd APG Meeting for WRC-07 in early 2006.

Decision no. 14 (APG2007/2/9)

The plenary decided that the duration of the 3 rd APG Meeting for WRC-07 should be at least for five days.

Decision no. 15 (APG2007/2/9)

The plenary agreed to hold the 3 rd APG Meeting for WRC-07 in Malaysia after the invitation from the Malaysian Administration to hold the meeting.

Decision no. 16 (APG2007/2/9)

The plenary confirmed its agreement to hold the 5 th APG Meeting for WRC-07 in Republic of Korea after the invitation from the Korean Administration to hold the meeting.
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Action Item 5 (APG2007/2/9)

The APT Secretariat should communicate with the Malaysian Administration for the date and venue of the meeting after discussion. Related information would be circulated to the APT Members.
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10. OTHER BUSINESS

Mr. Agarwal announced that it was his sad duty to advise the meeting that Dr. Murotani, from Japan, had recently passed away. Dr. Murotani had spent a long and successful career in radiocommunications including important contributions to the work of ITU, including his work for many years as Chairman of ITU-R study Group 9, dealing with the fixed service. He had also participated over an extensive period in the work of the APG, where his knowledge and expertise were much appreciated.

Mr. Agarwal also reminded participants of the sad event that had caused Dr. Wee to urgently leave the meeting, as his father had passed away.

The meeting stood for one minute's silence in tribute to these two gentlemen. It was decided that Mr. Agarwal would ask that messages of condolence be sent from the APT to Dr. Wee and to the family of Dr. Murotani.

Mr. Arasteh reminded the APG of the informal group for WRC-07 which holds meetings from time to time to consider possible conference structures and potential office holders at the conference. Mr. Agarwal indicated that the informal character of the group should be maintained and suggested that APG participants who are available should try to attend these informal meetings, often held in Geneva, in order that other APG participants can be kept aware of developments. Dr. Jamieson, in supporting this idea, requested that those attending these informal meetings provide reports for circulation to APT members, for their information.

Mr. Gracie advised that the next meeting of the RAG would be from 31 October to 4 November, 2005 and that a meeting of the informal group was scheduled during that time.

11. CLOSING

Mr. Agarwal noted that it had been a very successful meeting, with a number of initial preliminary views being developed in all of the Working Parties.

He thanked the Executive Director, and Deputy Executive Director of APT and the APT staff for their excellent support for the meeting. He congratulated the Working Party Chairpersons, the Vice-Chairman of the APG and the Chairman of the Editorial Committee on the successful completion of the work, in the limited time available. He also thanked representatives from the regional groups Arab Preparatory Group, CEPT and CITELE as well as participating international organizations and other organizations and private entities as well as the representatives from ITU. He noted that delegates from APT administrations had made an excellent contribution and he appreciated their spirit of mutual cooperation and understanding.

Mr. Arasteh thanked Mr. Agarwal for his able chairmanship, his patience and competence and for his guidance and advice.

Mr. Agarwal responded by confirming that the success of the meeting was due to efforts of the participants themselves.

Mr. Narayan congratulated the office bearers on their work and was pleased that APG2007-2 had been a very successful meeting.

He reminded the meeting of the imminent departure of Mr. Railton to New Zealand after the completion of his work at APT. He expressed his warm thanks to Mr. Railton who had been a major contributor to the successful work of the APG, first as its Vice-Chairman and later as the APT official responsible for the APG activities.

Mr. Narayan welcomed Mr. Yamada, the recently elected Deputy Executive Director of the APT, to the work of the APG.

He thanked delegates from APT administrations, the representatives from the regional groups

Arab Preparatory Group, CEPT and CITEEL, the international organizations and other organizations and private entities as well as the representatives from ITU. He particularly thanked the APT Secretariat for their excellent work.

Mr. Narayan then presented gifts to the various Chairpersons in recognition of their outstanding work.

In closing Mr. Narayan wished all participants a safe journey home and invited everyone to meet again at APG2007-3.
